Opportunity Description:

The Norway Beach Recreation Area is located on the East side of Cass Lake, 6 miles east of the town of Cass Lake. in Northern Minneste. We are located within the boundaries of the Leech Lake Reservation. The area consists of 4 campground loops with 170 sites total. The loops all have flush toilets and hot showers. Many are on the National Reservation System.

Volunteer furnishes own self-contained trailer or camper. Water, electricity, radio, tools, and supplies are provided. As a Host, you'll earn a stipend amounting to \$18 per day worked. Hosts will be provided with a vest, hat, and/or shirt with an identification patch, and a Host sign for your site.

As a Campground Host you will typically be expected to greet visitors, provide information, monitor firewood, monitor reservations, answer questions about recreation and trails, refer campers to points of interest, explain the fee system, campground rules and regulations and help campers feel at home. This position requires moderate duty maintenance, cleanup of facilities, record keeping, dedication and concern for public recreation opportunities. Host(s) are expected to be personable and neat in appearance. We ask that you are on-site five days per week, especially during weekends and heavy use holidays. Volunteers are asked to work a minimum of 20 hours per week. We are interested in volunteers who can work at least Memorial Day through Labor Day. Applicants must be at least 18 yrs of age by the reporting date.
